SAINT PAUL'S CHURCH, HONITON.

THE Committee, appointed to carry out the Plan for putting a NEW ROOF, &c., to ST. PAUL'S CHURCH, HONITON, having through the liberality of the Subscribers been enabled to bring the same to a successful conclusion, have now much pleasure in laying before their friends a Report of the Sums of Money raised, together with their disbursement.

The Account would have been presented to the Public at an earlier period, had not a few of the Subscriptions remained unpaid; which circumstance has been the occasion of some little delay, although the Committee were most anxious to avoid it.

The Roof has been constructed in accordance with the Plans kindly furnished and given by WILLIAM TITE, Esq., London; who, in addition to the above, made a liberal Donation of 10 Guineas.

The Work was undertaken and performed by Mr. WILLIAM LEE, Builder, Honiton, who has completed his Contracts most satisfactorily: and the Alterations have not only given safety and comfort to the Fabric, but have also added considerably to the beauty of the Building. The Walls too have been thoroughly cleaned down, and most of the Windows re-fixed.

The Organ Gallery has also been re-constructed and enlarged, furnishing room enough to bring the whole of the Organ within the body of the Church, and thus they have obtained the full power of that excellent and fine-toned Instrument; which, under the management of Mr. BROOKING, Organ Builder, Exeter, has been put into excellent order. To him the removal and necessary alterations were intrusted, and it is due to him to say that he evinced much patience and labor during the time he was engaged in the difficult task; and in no way has he slighted the Work, but has left the Instrument in a most perfect state.

The Committee, therefore, whilst they now return their best thanks to all who kindly aided in the restoration of this Temple of God,—especially to those who having no connection with the Town, were led to contribute to the work because they would have Him held in honor, Whom they delight to serve,—would also most gratefully acknowledge the good providence of God, Who out of darkness raised up light, and in the midst of difficulties opened a way for the accomplishment of His purposes; that the doors of His Sanctuary may not be closed against the humble worshipper, but that there, in the name of Him to Whose service they have been called, they may still bow the knee to the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, Who has promised to be with His faithful people even unto the end, and that where two or three are gathered together in His name there will He be in the midst to pour down upon them the comforting influences of the Holy Ghost, that they may be sanctified in body, soul and spirit, unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.
